- Conduct art historical research and prepare PowerPoint presentations independently
- Attend occasional training sessions which will be recorded for future reference

- Bachelor's degree in art history, museum studies, museum education, or related field, master's preferred
- Deep knowledge of art history

- Knowledge of modern and contemporary art
- Five or more years related experience working in museums and/or teaching art history
- Strong verbal skills, dynamic educator
- Flexibility in adapting to the needs of diverse audiences
- Reliability
- Experience teaching in a museum with original works of art (for onsite teaching) and/or familiarity teaching on Zoom with Power Point presentations (for virtual teaching)
