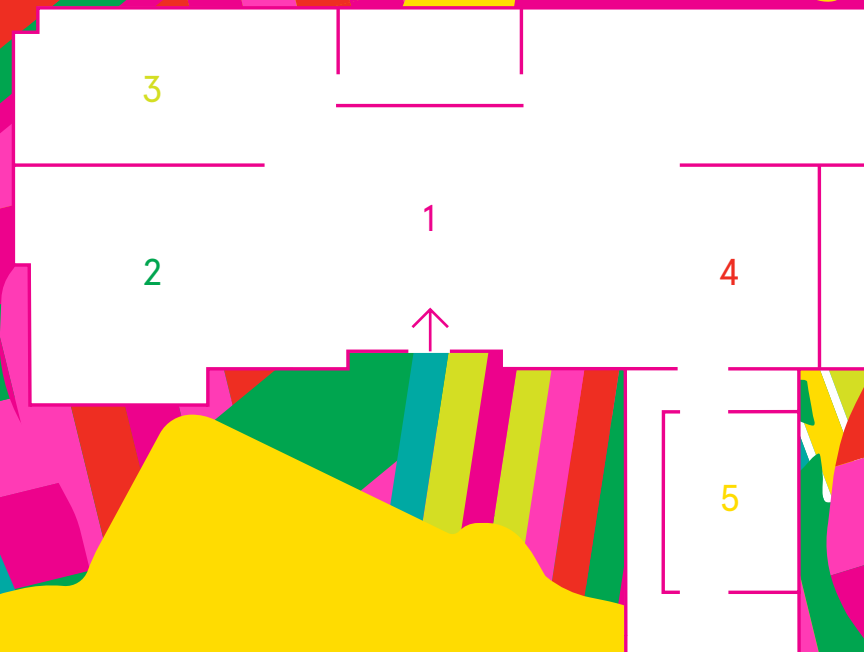

3. The Long Shot

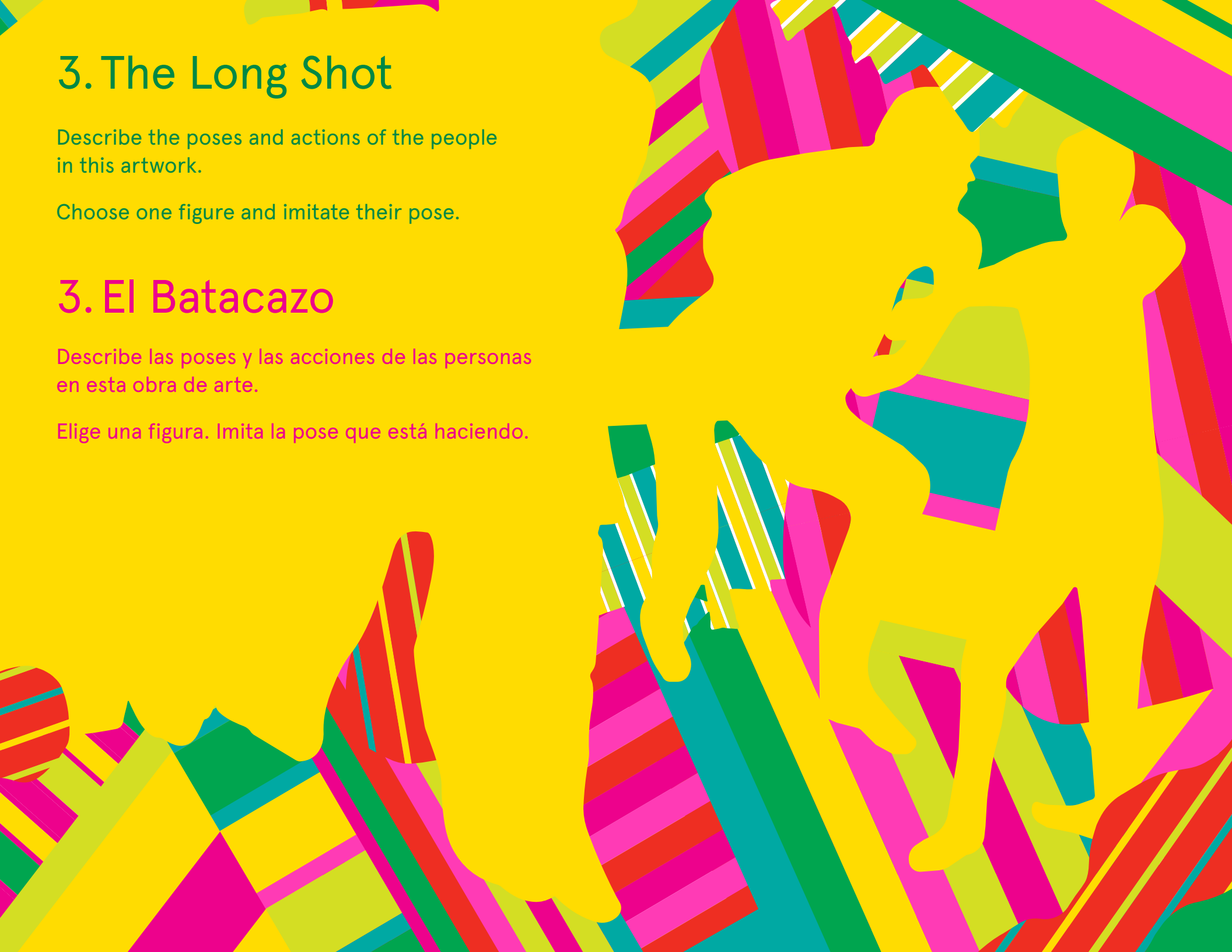
Describe the poses and actions of the people in this artwork.
